- FSU Football Defensive Coordinator, Mickey Andrews, Announced His Retirement

After 26 Seasons, Andres will turn his attention completed to his family. Andrews, the architect of the “Noles defense since 1984, has announced that he will retire at the end of the 2009 season. One of the nation’s most respected defensive coaches, the 68-year old Andrews, made his decision public stating, “For 47 years it’s been about me. Now it’s time to be about us – my family.”

- Researcher Wins Major Grant to Target TB

Timothy A. Cross, the Earl Frieden Professor of Chemistry & Biochemistry at FSU and director of the Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR) program at the Nation High Magnetic Field Laboratory, has received \$3.1 million to advance his research in the fight against tuberculosis.

- Protein Discovery May Lead to Better Ways to Fight Cancer

FSU College of Medicine researcher, Akash Gunjan, has solved a century-old mystery about proteins that play a vital role in the transfer of the human genetic code from one cell to another. The discovery could lead to finding new ways to help the body fight a number of diseases, including cancer.

- Benefits of Frugality in Tough Times Is Research Topic

College of Business Professor, Wayne Hochwarter, and his research associate, master’s candidate and football quarterback, Christian Ponder, have examined the saving and spending philosophies of employees who are experiencing job insecurity and have confirmed the value of family thriftiness in reducing anxiety.

- Promising Superconductor to Be Investigated at FSU

The Applied Superconductivity Center at the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory has received \$1.2 million in funding from the U.S. Dept. of Energy to understand and enhance a

new form of superconducting material that could be used to build more powerful magnets used in a wide range of scientific research.

- FSU Researcher Wins NIH Grants for Early Detection of Autism

Amy Wetherby, director of the Autism Institute in the College of Medicine, has been awarded 2 separate grants from the NIH totaling \$2.4 million to continue her work in detecting autism in children as young as 18 months.

- Film School Students Dominate National Competition

Students in the FSU College of Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts have given another bravura performance, claiming a majority of the awards handed out in a new film documentary competition devoted to highlighting the works of philanthropic and charitable organizations.

- Students Present Prestigious Oglesby Award to Wetherell

The Garnet and Gold key student leadership honorary presented the 2009 Ross Oglesby Award to FSU President, T.K. Wetherall at the FSU Alumni Association’s Homecoming Awards Breakfast on Oct. 3st.
